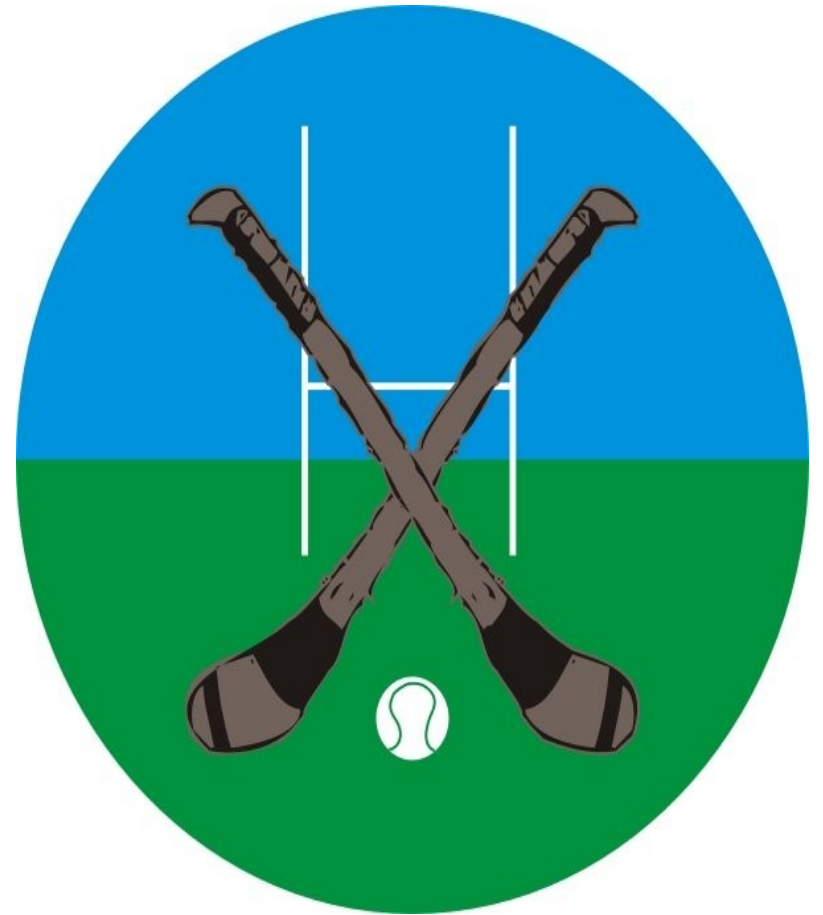
Ethna's Achievements

- Ethna was also the regular Dublin Goalkeeper winning eight All Ireland medals!
- Ethna played for Dublin alongside Camogie legends Kathleen Mills and Kathleen Cody, she also played alongside some of her Celtic team mates Uná O'Connor, Eileen Duffy and Ally Hussey.
- Teamwork, Skill and Confidence were the hallmarks of these great Dublin sides.
- From 1949 until 1969 Dublin won eighteen out of twenty All Ireland championships, despite reaching numerous finals they would have to wait until 1984 to secure their next and most recent All Ireland title.

Faughs History



- Faughs GAA Club is a hurling and camogie club in Templeogue Dublin. They have won 31 titles.
- It was founded in Easter 1885, "under the big tree" in the Phoenix Park in Dublin. Its opening meeting was held at 4 Gardiner's Row, home of Michael Cusack (now the Dergvale Hotel).
- The club name, Faughs, comes from the Irish language slogan, *fág an bealach*, meaning "clear the way," a battle cry used by ancient Irish warriors.
- The early years of the 20th century proved to be very successful for the club, which won the first four senior championships—four in a row, 1900–1904—and another five before 1920.
